**the fine-tuning design argument** - single-universe hypothesis, there is only one universe, and it is ultimately an inexplicable, "brute" fact that the universe exists and is fine-tuned. many atheists, however, advocate another hypothesis, one which attempts to explain how the seemingly improbable fine-tuning of the universe could be the result of chance.

**the argument from cosmological fine-tuning** - to say that our universe is fine-tuned in this sense is not to imply that there is a fine-tuner, an intelligent agent who had a hand in setting the values of the physical constants. it is just to say that these constants happen to fall in the narrow range required for life to exist.
